Field Trip

2 & 3 November 2019 : Delamere

Organiser: Tony Endersby

Venue: - 60-acre private property, approx. 20 acres open with the remainder open yacca bush and native trees with marked walking tracks, 2 dams, nice views, native animals and birds, 6 level caravan/camping sites, 2 onsite vans (basic), open fires for warmth and cooking, great sunsets and good company. Dogs allowed but must be kept under control.

Location: - 6km south of Delamere towards Cape Jarvis. 90km/hr. right hand bend (about 1km after power/phone tower on right) part way round bend turn right through gateway (not closed) /road with `no through road sign` and lot no 9108. (Lot 9108 main south road on GPS should work). Drive all the way to end of gravel road until you get to 2 gates and a big shed. Take left hand gate/straight ahead and follow fence line until you get to large green shed and shipping crate. Look for caravans and other club members. Road is suitable for small cars if you proceed with caution.

If any problems call Tony Endersby 0418 851 419 - phone reception is spasmodic so leave message if no answer.

Format options:

- camp for weekend as some will be there on Friday night and leaving Monday morning. No mains power but 12v solar available at shed. Plenty of water
- arrive and leave at any time on Saturday or Sunday.

Activities: -

- night photography
- landscapes (sunrise and sunset)
- wild life and/or wild flowers (hopefully)
- insects and small plants
- social activities / combined meal on Saturday night around campfire (BBQ available)

11 September 2019 : Presenter: David Rowlands

Topic: Creative Macro

David's presentation was very informative. He initially outlined "why macro" which led into "what is macro photography". As an accomplished photographer he outlined the need to get closer using extension tube(s), diopters, bellows, tele macro and dedicated macro lenses. David suggested other additional equipment, viz. tripod, flash, reflectors, diffusers, "plamp", focusing rails and coloured cards for your own background. He spoke about keeping the composition simple with clean backgrounds, and to be prepared to manual focus and to get at the level of the subject for the best point of view. His images were well received and with much envy of David's talent in macro photography.

The following is a summary of PaulWilliams' presentation "Common Lighting Setups for Portrait Photography" from the Workshop.

A lighting pattern is determined by the direction of light and is how the light and shadow come into play on the subject's face. There are four common portrait lighting patterns used by photographers:

- split
- rembrandt
- loop
- butterfly

There are also two lighting styles:

- broad, and
- short lighting,

which can be applied along with most of the patterns.
